This vessel placed on the blocks in dry dock & the bottom examined & found satisfactory.—

It was found to be broken & blistered in places—where such was the case it has been cut out & renewed.— with Resphelt.

The timbers were afterwards cemented & washed, & the loose ceiling & timber boards replaced.—
