REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR *Condition, & alterations.*

This vessel has been placed in Dry Dock the bottom examined and found in good order has been cleaned and re-coated.

The bulwarks in the "Well" have now been raised to the height of the Bridge & Forecastle Decks, formed of plates 6 1/2" thick and stiffened with T bars 6 x 3 spaced about 5' 0" apart; Side bulk beams 9 x 9 1/16 with double angles 3 x 3 x 5/16 fitted across the "well" and connected to the T bars with brackets, three of these beams being portable. No deck of any kind being laid upon these beams.
