## SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

**ANDALUSIA** (s).—*Rotherhithe, July 21, 8 15 p.m.*—  
 About 7 30 p.m. while the steamer Andalusia, of Stockton,  
 was swinging off Globe pier, she was run into by steamer  
 Blanchland, of Newcastle, bound down. The Andalusia  
 was struck on port side amidships, causing her to sink;  
 and now lies beached at King and Queen wharf.

**ANDALUSIA** (s).—*Gravesend, July 22, 7 20 a.m.*—  
 Steamer Blanchland, of Newcastle, in ballast, collided off  
 Cuckold's Point at 7 25 last evening with steamer Andalusia,  
 of Stockton, from Middlesbrough. Latter vessel was struck  
 on port side abaft midships, and was towed ashore on  
 Cuckhold's Point in a sinking condition. The Blanchland  
 is reported to have been uninjured and has proceeded to  
 Shields.
