The vessel has been placed in dry dock and the bottom cleaned down, examined & recoated. The Rudder has been rebrushed. Ceiling and timbers in excess of the requirements, lifted from Mainmast to fore end of vessel, frames, floors & cleaned & recoated and cement examined in way of same. The ceiling was not lifted at after end, the ballast not being removed.

The equipment has been examined & found in good condition.
