Vessel placed in dry dock, bottom examined cleaned and painted. all the spar ceiling in the tween decks and hold and all the close ceiling all fore and aft removed and all oxidation beaten and chipped off all the ironwork all fore and aft, cement and ironwork examined, the ironwork below close ceiling recoated with cement wash and the ironwork above close ceiling repainted. The ceiling battens replaced, about one-third of the close ceiling renewed and the remainder relaid. The fore peak examined and ironwork in some scaled and recoated with paint and cement wash. The lining in port removed in way of sidelights and ironwork examined Pumps & sluice examined, windlass ironing and lining stripped for examination, chain cables ranged, mast wedges removed, masts spars and rigging over-hauled and the fore and main lower yards & spanker gaff now renewed


