This steamer was placed in dry dock in consequence of it having been reported that the vessel was stranded on the Shoebury sands on the 1st February 1895. for about 11 hours.

The bottom was examined cleaned and recoated

Notice was given to the marine superintendent that the special survey no. 3. was become due in June next, and was informed that the vessel would probably be presented for inspection in August or September next, when the vessel would be again placed in dry dock.


