REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR Special Survey 2nd

Vessel placed in dry dock, bottom examined cleaned and painted. Rudder lifted and pintles retouched.

The timber boards and loose ceiling hatches as required by Rule lifted all fore and aft and the cement and ironwork examined & found in good condition. The fore peak cleared and examined and the sluice valve in collision bulkhead repaired.

The deck bored and examined, chain cables raised, windlass running stripped and examined, pumps and sluices examined, mast wedges removed; masts spars and rigging overhauled and main upper topsail yard renewed of pitch pine. The outer jib stay and fore topmast stay renewed and the lanyards renewed as necessary.
