ature of Survey *Condition and Insulation of holds.*

The bottom of this vessel has been examined in dry dock, Nos. 1 and 2 holds have been insulated up to the main deck; all ceiling removed from top of tanks in these holds; the tanks tested; the spar ceiling in lower holds and 'tween decks up to main deck removed, and the steelwork scaled and painted; watertight doors fitted to the holes cut in the watertight bulkhead for the trunk ways; additional stanchions fitted to lower deck beams under the refrigerating engine; main deck stringer doubled in way of opening cut for entrance to refrigerating engine room; and the chain cables ranged.

It is submitted the vessel appears worthy to remain classed 100A1 "Awning deck, With freeboard", and to have record of survey 8, 95 Lon. as recommended.
