REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR Damage

In consequence of the vessel having been reported to have stranded in the River Seine on 29/6/96

and remained fast for about 48 hours also for touching the ground on the 1/7/96 whilst on her voyage to Paris.

This steamer was placed in dry dock, the bottom examined, several bays of cement repaired, several rivets in Bilge Keel renewed and the bottom, cleaned & coated.

The rudder lifted & pintles bushed, a bulwark plate on port side faired & one stanchion repaired. This latter damage was stated to have been caused by collision with a barge.
