SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

Vessel was sunk by collision whilst lying loaded at the buoys off Woolwich on 26<sup>th</sup> March.

In accordance with the Committee's instructions the usual casualty notice was sent to the Owners on 30<sup>th</sup> March.

In reply they state:-

"Up to the present this vessel has not been raised, but the Thames Conservancy think they will be successful at the beginning of next week, and we shall be glad if you will defer taking any steps as to her entry in your Register Book until she is raised, and we have had an opportunity of seeing where she needs repairing

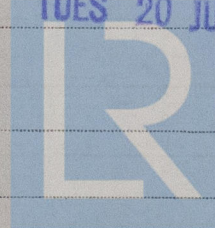
