SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

**ALBERTINA** (s).—*Blackwall*, March 26, 7 9 a.m.—At 3 35 a.m., as the steamer *Albertina*, of Newcastle, loaded coal, was proceeding up river off Arsenal Bank, Woolwich, she collided with the steamer *Sir Galahad*, of London, loaded, lying at the Gallions buoys, doing considerable damage to the latter vessel's starboard side and sinking the same. No lives lost.

**ALBERTINA** (s).—*Gravesend*, March 26, 12 3 p.m.—The steamer that sunk the *Sir Galahad* was the *Albertina*, from Goole for Waddel's Wharf. Latter vessel is apparently uninjured.

**ALBERTINA** (s).—*North Woolwich*, March 26, 9 54 a.m.—Steamer *Albertina*, passing through Gallions Reach at 5 a.m. this morning, collided with steamer "*Svengalia*," lying at Gallion Buoys, sinking the "*Svengalia*;" crew saved.
