Ballast-tank under Engines & Bunkers tested satisfactorily and lower bunkers examined and found in good condition.

The ballast-tank under after hold was opened but, by a mistake on the Engineer's part; when ready for examination, the tank was again flooded (partly) and as the vessel was ready for sailing, no examination, other than through the manholes in top, could be made. As far as could be thus seen, the inside was in good condition.

The Owner's representative stated that the tank would be submitted to survey on the vessel's next return in about 3 months time.
