Précis of particulars of Casualty

*Vessel was in collision in Clement's Reach, R. Thames, on 24<sup>th</sup> Jan. & was put ashore where she filled. She was pumped out & refloated the same day but had again to be put ashore to prevent sinking.*

*The next day the holes were patched, and after being pumped out the vessel proceeded under her own steam to Ratcliff-cross Pier.*

*The usual notice has not been sent to the Owners in this case but it is thought well to submit the circumstances for the Committee's consideration.*

*The London Surveyors state that the vessel is going into dock & that the case is under their attention.*

## SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

**WINSLOE** (s).—*Greenhithe*, Jan. 24, 2 8 p.m.—Winsloe (s) collided with James Cameron (s) in St. Clement's Reach. Former vessel was put ashore north shore in sinking condition. Latter proceeded up river.

**WINSLOE** (s).—*Gravesend*, Jan. 24, 3 2 p.m.—Steamers James Cameron, of Sunderland, from Shields, and Winsloe, of London, from Rotterdam, collided about 1 40 this morning in St. Clement's Reach. Latter vessel was run ashore above West Thurrock where she filled; former vessel proceeded up river, damage unknown.

**WINSLOE** (s).—*Greenhithe*, Jan. 24, 3 31 p.m.—Winsloe (s), previously reported, pumped out by Thames Conservancy pumping lighters and refloated at 2 45 p.m., being assisted by tug Britannia; she now lies moored to one of the adjusting buoys below Greenhithe.

**WINSLOE** (s).—*Greenhithe*, Jan. 24, 4 8 p.m.—Winsloe (s), previously reported, was found to be making too much water, so they unmoored her from the buoy, and she now lies ashore on the south side St. Clement's Reach.

**WINSLOE** (s).—*Greenhithe*, Jan. 25, 8 10 a.m.—Winsloe (s), previously reported, has had holes patched up, water pumped out, and left here about 2 a.m. under her own steam for Ratcliff-cross Tier.
