Repairs now effected:— On starboard side, in way of coal bunker, 1 Plate of strake next below sheer band, 1 plate of strake next below again renewed; 1 plate of bilge strake removed faired and replaced; 3 plates of bilge strake and 1 plate of each of the other two strakes next above faired in place and riveting and caulking of same made good, 3 frames faired in place and 4 bunker stays removed faired and replaced. A few minor repairs effected.
