Now done: Propeller, Stern-bush and outside fastenings of Sea Connections Examined in dry dock and found in good order.

The Owners intended to fit a new Donkey Boiler to this vessel now, but this will be deferred until next voyage. This proposal is respectfully submitted to the Committee's favourable consideration.

General Observations, Opinion, and Recommendation:—

The Machinery of this vessel so far as now seen is in good order and in my opinion eligible to remain as classed without fresh record, subject to a new Donkey Boiler being fitted next voyage.
