State also the dates and initials of any letters respecting this case.

REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR

Condition

"This vessel has been examined in dry dock, the bottom cleaned & coated and some half-damaged rivets in rudder renewed.

Nos. 2, 4 & 5 lower 'tween decks have been insulated (at New York) In Nos. 4 & 5 the iron centre line shipting-board bulkhead has been removed, and in its place pillars and a double angle stringer fitted as required by the rules. No. 6 Bulkhead has been pierced with a doorway in the lower 'tween decks; it is no longer a W.T. partition & the record of Bulkheads in the Reg. book should be amended from 8 B.H. to 7 B.H..
