REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR *Special Survey No 3. now advanced some*

Fore and after peak tank tops cleared, and both these tanks tested as required and found satisfactory. Chain cables ranged, examined and found good and sufficient. To complete S. S. No 3 the following remains to be done. Viz. Nos 2 & 3 Holds, the inside of tanks in Nos 1 & 3 holds, & O B Spaces, including inside of ballast tank in way of same: bunkers below lower deck stringer plate, decks, plating in way of side lights, decks, & general equipment (except cables) including masts spars/mast wedges to remove if required) and pumps & sluices, W. T. doors to be examined, all close ceiling to be lifted and all ballast tanks of double bottom ^(not heeled) to be tested & shell plating drilled if necessary. Winter North Atlantic Freeboard marks effaced, same reported on proper form.
