REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR Special Survey No 1.

Hull and bottom examined in dry dock. Bilge keels have now been fitted for 150 feet amidships, and the bottom cleaned and recoated, Holds cleared. The Oil Tanks and after plate tanks tested. Pumps and peaks cleared, cleaned and recoated. Pumps, Winches and H. & S. Doors examined, cleared out under engines and hammers and found in good condition. Masts & Rigging examined, and all the requirements of the Rules complied with.
