Wood Ship "Parramatta", 1521 tons, h<sup>o</sup>/35  
in Register Book, built at Sunderland  
in 1866 - 5<sup>th</sup> month, and classed 15A.1.,  
"12 + 14 yrs mat", and received the "Half Time"  
Survey in 1873 at London.

She has now <sup>been</sup> specially surveyed with  
a view to an improvement of class  
under Amended Table A.

The frame of this vessel is English  
Oak, 12 years material, and the remainder  
of the material is of Oak, 16 years material,  
excepting a part of the stem & stern post,  
and two after pieces of the shelves, clamps  
and lower deck waterway, which are of  
English Oak, 12 years material, and the  
upper deck beams which are of Iron.

The workmanship is stated to be  
"superior", and the vessel appears to be  
well fastened.



It is respectfully submitted that
