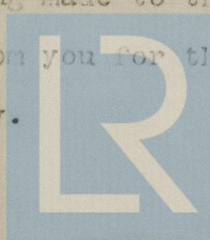

Dear Sirs,

I duly received your letter of the 2nd instant, respecting the account for the survey of the engines and boiler fitted in the steam tug "THAMES", and beg to inform you that, upon further enquiry, it appears that the fee of £4.4.0. to which you allude, was charged in respect of the boiler in question, which was then intended to be fitted in the steamer "STAPERAYNER". This amount should therefore be deducted from the account of £8.0.0. last rendered, leaving £3.15.0., and I shall be glad if you will kindly favour me with a remittance for this amount at your early convenience.

I am much obliged to you for having called my attention to the previous payment, and have to ask you to be good enough to accept my apologies for the mistake.

As regards the apparent delay in rendering the account, I should explain that it was rendered at the proper time to Messrs A. Wilson & Co., who were understood to be the responsible Engineers, but upon a further application being made to them, they stated that they simply took a sub-contract from you for the engines, and that you were responsible for the survey.
