Dear Sir

A report having been received in the office that your "Harcourt Dredger" recently caught fire at Havana and was filled with water, I am directed by the Committee to remind you that the Rules of the Society require all repairs of vessels classed in the Society Registre Book to be done to the satisfaction of the Society Surveyors and I shall be glad if you will kindly forward particulars of the damage sustained and also inform me what arrangements you propose making for the repair of damage being inflicted by the Society officers in order to render the vessel eligible to return to class. As the Society has no Surveyors at Havana I enclose a list of ports at which the Surveyors are stationed and I shall be glad if you will state when and at what port the matter will receive attention.

I take this opportunity to again point out that the Special Survey 1st as prescribed by the Rules became due in October 1892. A notice of this circumstance was sent you in the 20th November last, but the Committee do not appear to have received any reply. I enclose a printed statement setting forth the requirements of the Survey in greater detail than before, and I am, Dear Sir, awaiting your early reply.
