Dear Sir,

I am directed by Lloyd's Register of British & Foreign Shipping to put myself in communication with you with reference to the Special Survey No.1. of your s/s "Higuerote".

I think you would find it to your advantage to send the steamer to this port to be docked rather than to Martinique.

As your vessel is trading on the Venezuelan Coast there is very little difference in the distance to either of the above ports and I understand ~~the~~ the Dock at Barbados compares favourably with that at Martinique as regards both expense and despatch given.

The charges at the Barbados Dock are 2/- per day per Gross Register Ton for the first day and 6d per ton for each succeeding day; vessels of 240 feet can be taken on.

As I am stationed here I should be able to hold the Survey at any time and immediately on the vessel's arrival, providing due notice were given to the Owner of the Dock.
