Carenero Railway & Co Ltd.

Mr. Robert Anderson has forwarded me your letter to him of the 26th ulto. I have made inquiries upon the subject of that letter and find that Mr. Orange, the new Manager of the Company in Venezuela, has probably by this time sent the S.S. "Higuerote" to Martinique to be docked and cleaned. Apparently he has sent her there in ignorance of an arrangement which Mr. Anderson appears to have made with you in September last, viz, that this steamer should be sent to Demerara in order that your Surveyor might make an inspection for the purpose of re-classifying the steamer in your Register. Notwithstanding this, as I think it is desirable to retain the description of the vessel I shall be

obliged if you will arrange for the retention of the vessel's character in the Register Book. Kindly let me know if this can be done, and I will then communicate with Mr. Orange requesting him to take the earliest opportunity of having the vessel inspected by your Surveyor.

When my clerk called at your office the other day he learned that the Company's S.S. "Paparo" did not appear upon the Register. From the report of Mr. Anderson it appears that this steamer is 114 ft long and 144 tons measurement and as I understand all vessels exceeding 100 tons can be entered in your Register I shall be glad if you will inform me what steps should be taken to have this steamer also entered.
