P.S. The vessel only does a coasting traffic between the ports of La Guaira and Venezuela - under the name of Carenero - under the name of Higuero.

With further reference to your letter of 21st July and mine of 7th August: When in London last week I called upon you, but you were from home - I had the pleasure of a conversation with your Mr. Scott, with reference to the above Vessel belonging to this Company. —

From your circular, as explained, the nearest Port from La Guaira at which a survey could be held upon the vessel was at Demerara; which is some eight hundred miles from the former Port; whereas our Steamers are sent periodically (about once a year) to Martinique to be docked for cleaning being much nearer to La Guaira ^{taking into account} and also the risk is not so great in crossing the Caribbean Sea as the full force of the Atlantic in getting to Demerara.

From memory I think it is just about a year since the Higuero was docked and cleaned in Martinique. & as soon as I return to Venezuela, I purpose sending her there again early in 1895. I should therefore be glad to know if it would be convenient for you to make a survey in Martinique: & what would be the approximate cost.
