I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 10th. inst. submitting for the Committee's approval the plan of the steel boiler No. 477 you are about to construct under special survey, and with regard thereto I am directed to acquaint you that provided the Deighton furnaces, if made 3'.8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " outside diameter, be made 17/32" thick; the plan in other respects be adhered to, and the boiler be built under the usual conditions of survey and testing and to the entire satisfaction of the Society's local Engineer Surveyor, the same will be approved by the Committee for the intended working pressure of 160 lbs per square inch.

The plan referred to is returned herewith, and after noting same I shall be glad if you will again forward it for the Surveyor's guidance during construction.

I also enclose the usual special survey order form, which kindly sign and return at your convenience.
