I duly received your letter of the 16th instant in further reference to the case of your iron ship "INDIAN EMPIRE", and having submitted the same to the General Committee at their meeting this day, I am directed to acquaint you that upon the understanding that the vessel will be submitted to the Society's survey on her return home or at the first port at which she arrives where a Surveyor to the Society is stationed, the Committee will be prepared to accede to your request to have the character of the vessel reinstated, upon the receipt of a satisfactory cablegram from Lloyd's Agent at Callao respecting the completion of the remasting, rigging and repairs of the vessel at that port.
