I the undersigned did this day survey and carefully examine the Hull & Materials of the Schooner *Sir David Milne* 89 Tons p Register now under repair at the Building ways of Messrs Hoppers Ship Builders North Shore River Tyne. where she received the following ^{extensive} Repairs, consisting of fifteen fresh Plutocks, Part new Bottom, great part new Ceiling, from the Beams to the Kelson, New wood sheathed, with Patent Felt, a thorough Caulking, with all other necessary Repairs & replacements. She also had new decks, New Water ways, New Paint & shear strake at Scotland in 1829.

She is the Property of Thomas Hill Esq. I do hereby certify, that, in consequence of this vessel, having undergone the above stated repairs, that she is in a proper seaworthy state, and fit to take on board Dry, and Stowage goods, and Convey them to, and from any Port in perfect safety, as a good second class vessel.
