Sir,

In reply to your letter of the 2nd inst. re the fees on the Hull of the S. S. Yacht "Florida," Report N^o 5490. I beg respectfully to explain that when Mess^{rs} J. Cran & Co. arranged with us to have the vessel surveyed it was on the understanding that she was to be classed the same as Mess^{rs} S. & St. Morton's N^o 50, the "Magnet" S. S. Leith Report N^o 5480, "Steam Tug," & the same fees.

The builders will willingly pay the Fee of £5: on the Hull, which is £1:10/- more than charged on the "Magnet," & take the same class namely "Steam Tug" in the Register Book.

I am sorry that this difficulty

should have occurred, as I have no doubt, that, if it can be arranged as above stated, the future orders from the same owner, Mr. J. A. Walker, the contractor for the Manchester Canal, will be built to class.
