Sir,

In reply to your letter of the 31<sup>st</sup> ult., respecting the unpaid fees on S.S. "Emerald" I beg to acquaint you that on the 24<sup>th</sup> ult. I made application in writing to Messrs. Munn Bros in accordance with your instructions. - A reply was received from them, but at an interview which I had with the principal partner abt. 3 weeks ago & again today, he informed me that the fees are payable by the owners of the vessel or by the maker of Machinery to whom he had forwarded my letter of application with strong representations to discharge the debt, the reply received by him being to the effect that neither of these parties consider themselves liable for payment.

Mr. Munn added that, when signing the survey request he understood that he was liable only for fees on Hull & that he is not disposed to pay those on Machinery.

It appears some that a letter sent from the London office to the makers of Machinery, might possibly have the desired effect, which course is the only one I can suggest. -
