Sir,

I beg to forward the accompanying particulars of Chain Cables intended for 3 m. Schooner *No 3*, under construction at Inverkeithing & to point out that, while the total weight of these chains, according to the Rules under which vessel is building, should be $140 \frac{3}{4}$ cwt., the actual weight is: 140.2.9., being 19 lbs. short.

This small difference will, I presume, be allowed to pass, but finding that the $97 \frac{1}{2}$ fath. are ^{cwt. lbs.} 69.7.20 in weight instead of 70.1.13, or nearly 1 cwt. short, I shall be glad to receive instructions whether these chains will be approved.
