S, I duly received your letter of the 5th Instant respecting the fees still outstanding for your surveys on the Trawlers "MOUNT ROSA", "MOUNT VISO" and "SIMPLEON" (Reports Nos. 8829, 8861 & 8882), and with regard thereto I have to request that as Messrs. Cuming & Ellis, who built the vessels, failed some years ago, the firm having since become extinct and the statutory limitation for the recovery of the debt has expired, you will write the amount of the fees (£22-16-0) off your books and omit the vessel's names from your returns of outstanding accounts.

I may add that the sum of £34-1-0 mentioned in your letter appears to have included a fee on the "MARQUERITE DEFFAUX" and a subscription to the Register Book which have already been written off.
