### REPAIRS

Has had put to the hold beams 25 pairs of 2 in. hanging knees, extending down to take two bolts into the substantial part of the floors, except forward and aft where prevented by the breasthooks and pointers. Sent to the deck beams 27 pairs of 2 in. hanging knees. Also had two additional breasthooks and 2 latches, of 2 in., as recommended by Mr. Latham. To the deck and hold beams no more 2 in. hanging knees can be profitably put. The stores now supplied are 300 fathoms of 1 3/4 chain, a Patent Anchor 30-1-14, Body 3-1-0, 90 fathoms of 10 1/2 in. Hawser, 90 do of 6 in., Nearly a second suit of sails, and a boat. And the ship has been caulked and sheathed with yellow metal on felt. The chain brought home from Miramichi has been taken on shore. She has also had an 2 in. breasthook put over the bowsprit, in addition to what is stated above.
