To the Secretary of Lloyd's Register
Sir

In reply to your letter of the 4th

Inst^o with a letter enclosed from Mr McKenzies
with remarks on the building and classification
of the Smack ^{App 10} "Robert Hadden", I beg to refer you to my
report N^o 1511, which is to the best of my belief a
faithful report, of the materials answered in
each place required to be given, the only thing
named to me by the Master was the Wurdlass ends
he did not say to me he wished them altered if
so I should have requested the builder to have
done it, I did say to him if he had irons fitted
to the holes, it would prevent the holes wearing
away as there was so little grip, thinking it would
be seldom used being such a small end, by a
mistake of the Foreman the ends of the spindle was
corrued through, The Chains referred to I beg to call
your attention to my letter of the 3rd of July as a
correct statement from the Certificate. The Mast
as stated in my report as sufficient, when I asked
the Builder as in all other cases was replied yes

at that time I had not heard of any complaint
Immediately I received the owners letter I called
on Mr Warlow, showed his attention to what was
complained of, he then wrote to Mr McKenzie assuring
him to get what was then stated put to his own
satisfaction and he would pay for it, the last
of Mr McKenzies. I also showed the Builder, he said
I am prepared to pay all reasonable demands
of the Owner, If I have erred in this case I
beg your indulgence and the kind consideration
of the Committee,

with your permission I enclose the
Builders notes on this painful subject to
me. I suppose it will explain the Mis-
understanding that has taken place but
I cannot help thinking one or the other
have not confined themselves to the truth
