In reference to your letters of 15<sup>th</sup>  
and 27<sup>th</sup> Inst and enclosed correspondence  
relating to the smack Robert Hadden's  
I beg to inform you that upon notice having  
been given at this office that the vessel  
was ready for survey a tract was made to  
her with a recommendation that she should  
be placed on a slipway. Upon the appended  
telegram being received from the owners  
he was replied to as follows (see copy of telegram)  
"Smack Robert Hadden must go on slip to  
have satisfactory survey"

No further communication having  
been received here I visited the vessel  
today and found her loaded. I was then  
informed by the Master that the vessel  
was about to proceed to Dunvegan (Hhys)  
but received no message from the owners

as to the course he contemplated taking  
with respect to the survey in question.

letters of 15<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> Inst are herewith  
returned with the first entry report  
upon the vessel.
