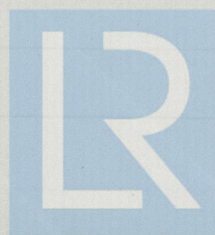
I duly received your telegram of yesterday and letter this morning about efficiently completing Vessel Windermere before certificate can be issued I was on board most of the day yesterday to see the riveting completed and did before I left but there is the cementing to be done it was not finished when I was there this forenoon but there is so little of it to do that it will be finished by noon I have promised to go off and see that it is completed tomorrow morning and if I am satisfied it is to telegraph to you to know if the ship can go to sea as the tug is laying waiting for to tow her out. Mr Fisher is here and waiting to see her off and if I am satisfied that the whole is done when I go off tomorrow morning I will telegraph you as soon after coming on shore as possible that everything is to my satisfaction (that is if it is so) Can the

vessel proceed to sea without the certificate as the
Owner is anxious to get her away, she is going to
New York in ballast. If I am satisfied everything is
right I will wire you so tomorrow and let your
reply say wheather she can proceed on her voyage
as the Owner says the certificate can follow
