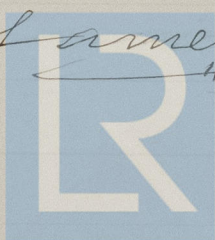
I beg to acknowledge the receipt
of your letter of yesterday's date respecting the
ordinary floors fitted in the Boiler space of
the S.S. Minister Tak van Oortvliet, and in
reply I have respectfully to acquaint you
that the floors in question are $17\frac{1}{2}$ ins in depth
 $\times \frac{1}{2}$ in thickness, with strong knee plates to each
floor and angles extending from the bottom to
the top of knee plates, for 11 spaces or $20'2"$ in
length, please see sketch enclosed.

I also enclose herewith a
tracing showing the position &c of two solid
half-round bars fitted on each side of this
vessel to prevent chafing.
