This Vessel was brought from Government hauld up and taken Down below the Water her Top Timbers are all New, English Oak and the whole of her Stern is New her Beams are of Red Pine except those in the Hatchways and Pawl bit which are of English Oak her Breast Hooks are New of English Oak and a New apron piece in oak of English Oak her planking is good and well fastened She has all new Spars Rigger and Sails with New Boats

I am of Opinion she is fit for the safe conveyance of dry and perishable Cargoes to and from all part of the World and should be Classed A 1 for Five Years

October 4. 1842

I saw this vessel twice at Poole - The repairs are fully to the extent required by the Second Rule for Retraction
