Sir

In reply to your favour of yesterday
respecting the Young Captain I beg to say that the
Footwaling and strake above were taken out
fore and aft the Floors and first footboards were
Exposed to View, which were perfectly Sound
Seven strakes only of ^{Old} Ceiling remained each side
which is very good I recommended cutting out
of several strips of the middle strake at different
places in all of which the Timbers were perfectly
sound and good her bottom plank from the
Keel up to the New work appears to be quite as
good as new I am very respectfully
