

Dutch Ship "L. J. Enthoven" 692 Ton
built at Rensdijk in 1864, and now
specially surveyed and recommended
to be classed "4". Restored 4 A-1.

As instructed I visited this
vessel, lying afloat at Schiedam,
in company with Mr Loos, and
with reference to the portion of the
rule which it was thought was
not complied with, on examination
it was found that the rules had
been substantially complied with;
the heads of the timbers were exposed
and thoroughly examined and found
to be in good condition: it is therefore
submitted that the vessel is worthy
of the favorable consideration of the Committee
to be classed as recommended by
Mr Loos. viz. Restored 1876 4 A -

The equipment is not in conformity
with the requirements of Table 22. There
being 105 fathoms of $1\frac{1}{16}$, 105 fathoms
of $1\frac{3}{16}$ and 90 fathoms of 1 inch, instead
of 240 fathoms of $1\frac{1}{16}$ as required by the
Rules, and a stream chain of $1\frac{3}{16}$
