In reply to your letter of the 26<sup>th</sup> Instant relative to the fore and after peaks of the I.S.S. "Rutland", we beg to state that there is no objection to fitting a water-tight flat of Iron on beams below the Iron main deck in the fore peak, and if you wish to make the after peak a water ballast tank to the main deck by removing all wood and cement from the top of Iron deck and to fit Iron shoes, as suggested, we see no objection, and shall be glad to attend to the work in progress, and witness the test of the same in conformity with the Rules.
