Dear Mr. Jordan,

I shall be glad if you will convey my thanks to Mr. Hanbury for thus calling my attention to the error in moulded depth as stated on my report on the S.S. "Baruto".

The depth as marked in my note book being indistinct I set this down 20 ft instead of 20 " 0 1/2 " which latter is as measured on the vessel.

I have corrected this in copy of report and shall be much obliged if you will do the

same for me on the Report in your possession; I regret very much the omission of the ^{rule} weight of the stream and bridge which should have been set down 11-1-0 - 5-2-0 & 2-3-0 this appears to have been quite overlooked in the numerous details now required in the First Entry Reports.

Thanking you for putting this matter right.
