In answer to the enquiries of the
Committee, of what description of Timber
the Sea rotten outside planks that were
removed from the bottom of the Ship
"Harrowby", 514 Tons, as stated in my Report
No 13830. consisted.

Respectfully beg to say that to the
best of my recollection, they were Red Pine,
Yumac and Birch, and that they were
taken out in consequence of defects, as first
named in my Report, but the Liverpool Committee
requested me to state more fully the extent
or nature of the defects. I then introduced
the words being all rotten. And now beg to
inform the Committee that the Planks were
rotten to a certain extent, and that some
of them had three or four large

piece in them, which I consider justified
me in recommending them to be removed.
