This vessel has been placed on patent ^{slip} & carefully caulked all over, and the Rule section 62 fully completed with, 7 Pair of Iron Ribs Riggers, extending from Knot beams to floor Heads with two bolts in floors - Carefully bolted with such bolts yellow metal, up to wales, 7 Pair of Staple Riggers of Iron in tween Decks, carefully bolted with such bolts - Bottom sheathed with yellow metal over patent felt, to wales,
