Hull

Bottom and rudder cleaned, examined and recoated.  
Cables ranged.  
The peaks, machinery spaces, decks, casings, ventilators,  
hatchways and closing appliances and general equipment  
examined. The holds, tween decks and structure under boilers  
examined as far as practicable. The steering gear and windlass  
examined.

Machinery

Propeller, tail shaft (drawn inboard), sea cocks and  
valves and outside fastenings.  
Examined H.P. and L.P. turbine rotors and casings. 1st and  
2nd reduction gear pinions and wheels and bearings, thrust  
and tunnel shafting, pumps, pumping arrangements,  
condenser (tested), steering engine and windlass.  
All (5) boilers examined internally and externally complete  
with doors and mountings and their safety valves adjusted.  
Fuel installation examined complete with supply pipes to  
burners.

and that we will transmit to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of  
Shipping, London, a Report stating that all repairs recommended  
by us have been completed to our satisfaction, and that we will  
recommend that she be assigned a Record of

efficient condition for a period of 12 months from September 1945,  
subject to Electrical installation being completed after arrival
