On April 29th 1920 examination was made of the tail shaft and propeller and the following was found:

Two propeller blades bent on tips and edges.

Three propeller blade studs bent and damaged on threads.

RECOMMENDED

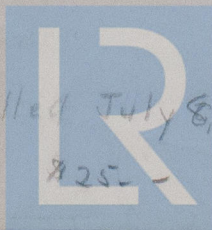
Two propeller blades to be faired and dressed up on edges and tips.

Damaged studs to be removed and three new studs fitted.

These repairs were completed to my satisfaction.
