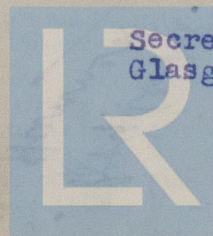
I may say that Mr. A.D. Aitken paid two visits to the Lawyers and one to the Court and that Dr. Webster also paid a visit to the Court.
