Dear Sir,

I have to inform you that the Ministry of Transport have advised this Office that an enquiry into the loss of the M.Y. "AARLA" is to be held, and have requested copies of various Reports and Certificates.

The only Load Line Certificate in this Office is a Provisional Certificate issued by you at Freetown on the 16th December, 1944, to enable the vessel to proceed to Dakar.

It is, however, observed from the Falmouth Surveyors' Report dated September, 1945, that :-

" It was noted that a Provisional Freeboard Certificate was issued at Freetown on July 3rd to enable the vessel to proceed to her port of destination i.e., a port on the River Clyde."

A copy of this Certificate does not appear to have been received in this Office, and I shall therefore be glad if you will forward a copy by Air Mail, together with any other Reports of Surveys carried out at that time.
