"HOPESTAR", 5267 tons gross of Newcastle, on the 31st May, 1946 and subsequently, as she lay afloat in Millwall Dock, on account of damage stated to have been sustained as the result of encountering heavy weather during 10th - 20th April, 1946, whilst the vessel was on a voyage U.K. to Halifax, N.S.,

and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and that I have Recommended that she be continued as now classed, without fresh record of survey, subject to permanent repairs to the Deep Tank being effected by the end of October, 1946, and to all other conditions at present attached to the vessel's class being dealt with as previously recommended,

being fit to carry dry and perishable cargoes.
