that I have Recommended that she be continued as classed without fresh record of survey, subject to upper deck plating abreast galley (p & s) and forward of No. 4 Hatch, (p & s), deep tank top plating (p & s) and indented shell plates in 3rd and 4th strake below sheer strake in way of deep tank (p.s.) being dealt with at first convenient opportunity. Also subject to all other outstanding items at present attached to vessel's class as previously recommended.


