the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of Messrs. Wilson & Burlington, Newcastle-on-Tyne, attend at the Works of Messrs. Cockburns, Ltd., Cardonald, on the 29th and 30th September and 1st October, 1938, for the purpose of inspecting 2 - 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Cast Steel Double Spring Safety Valves, Improved High Lift Type, and 2 - 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Cast Steel Single Spring Safety Valves, Improved High Lift Type.

The Valves were returned from the "HOPE STAR" by the Wallsend Slipway Co., Ltd., Newcastle, for re-conditioning.

In the presence of the undersigned the valve chests were subjected to an hydraulic pressure of 570 lbs. per square inch, shewed no signs of weakness, and were found tight and sound in every respect at that pressure. They were further subjected to a steam test, the valves lifting at 235 lbs. and closing at 280 lbs. without leakage, in the case of the two single valves. The two double valves shewed a slight leakage down to 200 lbs. As these valves were urgently required Messrs. Cockburns, Ltd. decided to return them to the vessel, and make a new set to be fitted at first opportunity.
